This 1912 home near Lake of the Isles is unmistakably the work of Purcell & Elmslie. During restoration of this National Register building, David Heide took special care to use historic fabrics and match the original materials and feel of the Prairie School house. The original butlery served as a model to recreate kitchen cabinets to original specifications. The table design was inspired by Arts & Crafts furniture popular at the time of the original construction. Reminders of the way the house operated historically, including wood panel doors concealing electrical service and the servant's annunciator, were restored and left in place. The kitchen is new, yet maintains a respect for the architecture of the home.

Heide designed a floor plan that allows guests to circulate freely through living, dining, and family rooms without disturbing the serious cooking going on in the kitchen galley. The kitchen island's elliptical curve is a graceful link between spaces and serves both as breakfast bar and buffet serving counter. Built-in alcoves accommodate hundreds of cookbooks, and the curved, deep drawers serve as a liquor cabinet. No political skeletons in this closet, but there is a foot-wide, 5-foot-deep cabinet holding a stepladder to get to those upper cabinets!
