Craftsman Kitchen



Project Type: Remodel

Location: Saint Paul

A complete overhaul of the inappropriate 1970's era kitchen brought this space up to standards suitable for this Arts & Crafts-style Summit Avenue residence. Originally designed for use by servants, the kitchen lacked views to the outside, suffered from poor layout, and provided no place for informal dining.



Three new windows onto the side yard provide for views and natural light while complying with Heritage Preservation guidelines that restrict alterations to street-facing elevations. Design of the new workspace layout provides ample counter space at each work area, plenty of storage, and display for the homeowner's collection of antique trays and pottery. The design of the table and its tuck-under stools allows it to double as both informal family dining and an additional prep area when needed.



The Craftsman aesthetic found throughout the house was introduced into the newly remodeled kitchen. Detailing of the cherry cabinetry and millwork, granite counters, and maple hardwood flooring all speak to the principals of the Arts & Crafts movement. New stainless steel appliances cater to more practical purposes, while reproduction and antique lighting maintain the historic character of the room.
